Wraparound: Intensive outpatient mental health services that address placement stability and permanency and decrease utilization of congregate care, inpatient hospitalization, juvenile justice and out of home placement									
Transition Age Youth Crisis Residential Program: Short-term residential treatment providing services for up to thirty (30) days in a structured, home-like setting. Interventions include crisis stabilization and symptom reduction, building interpersonal and independent living skills to support successful transition to the community									
Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP): Intensive mental health services in a residential setting provided in collaboration with families and other child serving systems									
Secured Settings: Intensive mental health treatment in a locked setting
