First responders and healthcare workers should follow their workplace protocol for return to work and refer to <a href="AFL 21-08.8">AFL 21-08.8</a>
<b>All other workers</b> should use the following criteria for returning to work following COVII 19 infection, regardless of vaccination status, previous infection or lack of symptoms:
<ul> <li>Persons should stay home for at least 5 days.</li> <li>Isolation can end after day 5 if symptoms are not present or symptoms are resolving and a diagnostic specimen* collected on day 5 or later tests negative. *Antigen test preferred</li> <li>If unable to test or they are choosing not to test, or testing positive on Day 5 (or later), isolation can end after day 10 if fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.</li> <li>If fever is present, isolation should continue until 24 hours after fever resolves.</li> <li>If symptoms, other than fever, are not resolving continue to isolate until symptoms are resolving or until after day 10.</li> <li>Per CDPH masking guidance, infected persons should wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings.</li> </ul>
