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Public Health Officer's Report	<p>Presented by Dr. Melody Law:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Flu season is still widespread but incidence in Sacramento County has been decreasing. The mask mandate is still in effect. • This is the peak Norovirus season. If providers have 3 or more cases they should report to public health and take samples. The Norovirus information can be found through the California Health Alert Network (CAHAN) which is state-sponsored web-based system used in Sacramento County to send warnings of impending or current situations that may affect the public's health. To register for CAHAN visit http://www.dhhs.saccounty.net/PUB/Pages/California-Health-Alert-Network-CAHAN.aspx and fill out the enrollment request. • Pertussis cases are trending up and tend to increase in the summer – this is a vaccine preventable disease. • The Smiles Keepers staff will be transitioning to the Prop 56 funding. The fluoride varnish program will be provided through the Center for Oral Health “Early Smiles” and they will serve the same target population.
NFP CAB Update	<p>Presented by Leesa Hooks and Tosha Ulicni:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The NFP funding has been reauthorized for another 5 years. Thanks to the Board for their support and help in getting the project refunded. • There is a Graduation on May 26th and all Board members are invited to attend. • The program has 4 nurses on staff and 110 cases- they are funded for 100 cases so any current referrals will be forwarded on to other eligible programs. • April 11th will be an Advocacy Day – there is some current additional funding through TANF for NFP clients for an evidence-based home visitation program. Looking for members to attend Advocacy Day for program sustainability • Tosha passed out a sheet with information on the cumulative premature birth rate, current work status and cumulative vaccination rates for NFP clients compared to California and national totals.

SNAP-Ed Update Obesity Prevention Program	<p>Presentation by Neela Satyanarayan</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provided an overview on the Obesity Prevention Programming funded by SNAP-Ed • Currently do work in high need census tracks to increase consumption of healthy foods and beverages, and increase physical activity. They work with adults and children and retail outlets. Starting some work with Early Childcare Centers. • There is a Rethink your Drink Activity scheduled for May16th and there will be some health education going on during Public Health week April 2-8, 2018
