Gun Violence By Crime Type

Gun violence in Sacramento County has dropped in all of the violent crime categories. In 2018, there was a 25% decrease in total gun violence when compared to the previous year (2017).

Gun Violence Compared To Total Violent Crime

Over the past 5 years, gun related crime accounts for 23.7% of all violent crime in the county. In 2018, gun related crime dropped to 20% of all violent crime from 26% in 2016.

Gun violence in the County has been fairly spread out between North and South Division. The Districts that seem to be impacted the most are District 1, 4, and 6. However, District 4 had a notable decrease in 2018 with a 39% drop compared to 2017.

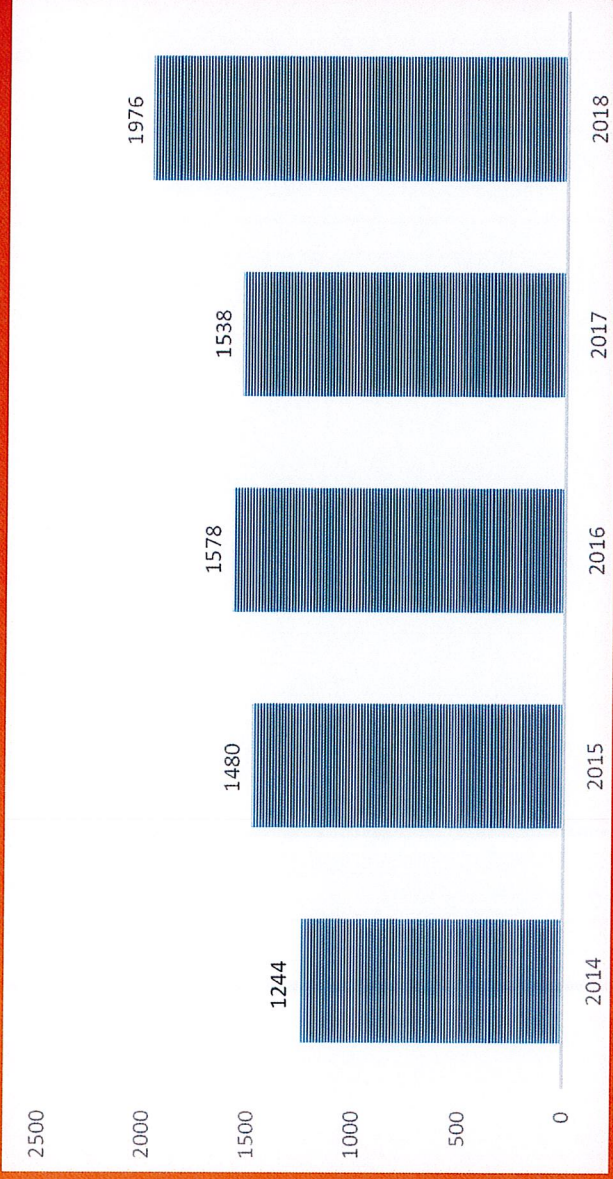
