	<ul> <li>Developed a youth marijuana prevention curriculum for 6th grade students.</li> <li>Developed the Future Forward media campaign to prevent marijuana use among youth, which included public service announcements; radio, movie theaters, billboards, public transit, mall kiosks, television, and digital media.</li> <li>Distributed opioid postcards to educate and prevent youth from abusing prescription drugs.</li> <li>Published the SCCY Action Plan, outlining the four environmental prevention strategies that guide the work and focus of the SCCY.         <ul> <li>Developing targeted media messaging</li> <li>Addressing laws, policies and practices</li> <li>Limiting youth access to alcohol and other substances</li> <li>Understanding and redirecting social norms.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Committee Reports	<ul> <li>Prevention and Education Committee Report</li> <li>Discussions primarily focused on Prop 64 funding. The Fruitridge Community Collaborative: PRO Youth and Families was awarded funds for re-entry services through a grant program issued by the Governor's office earlier this year. Sierra Health Foundation was recently awarded a large Prop 64 grant from the Department of Health Care Services, but there was uncertainty about the scope of the grant and potential future funding that may come through the California Department of Public Health and/or the California Department of Education.</li> <li>There was also some discussion about the large number of recent deaths on college campuses, including a recent alcohol poisoning death at Cal Poly State University involving a Bella Vista High School graduate. Discussion centered around the need to educate graduating high school students before they leave for college and their parents about the dangers of binge drinking and alcohol poisoning.</li> <li>Budget, Planning, Evaluation and Treatment Committee Report</li> <li>CalAIM, which was covered at the Alcohol and Drug Advisory Board Meeting, was discussed.</li> <li>National Association for Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors has monthly webinars. The January 15, 2019 webinar will focus on family prevention.</li> <li>Human Services Coordinating Council (HSCC)</li> <li>The HSCC has expressed interest in a criminal justice court presentation. Lori recommended presenters from the last Methamphetamine Coalition meeting.</li> </ul>
