Develop Goals for 2020	 The MHB developed the following principle to guide their work on 2020 goals: All goals should enable equitable distribution of services to ensure the optimal mental health of all populations, particularly for unserved and underserved diverse populations. The MHB developed the following seven goals for 2020 (Attachment 1), to be approved at the February meeting: Goal 1: Review and evaluate the effectiveness of BHS in implementing their 2020 priorities, and identify and advise on other community-defined needs. Goal 2: Engage and outreach to community members. Goal 3: Develop sources for data-driven decision making. Goal 4: Improve communication and cross-collaboration among sister organizations, such as the Alcohol and Drug Advisory Board, Cultural Competence Committee, and the Mental Health Services Act Steering Committee.
	 Goal 5: Advocate for mental health services for the homeless. Goal 6: Continue to advocate for systems change to address the need for maternal mental health services in Sacramento County. Goal 7: (Law Enforcement – language still under development)

Adult System of Care Committee Dan Niccum, Viva Asmelash, Maria Padilla-Castro, Laura Bemis, and Loran Sheley Other members to be appointed at a future date Children's System of Care Committee Caroline Lucas, Silvia Rodriguez, and Mike Nguy Other members to be appointed at a future date Goal 1 created the standing committees and allocated the priorities to those committees. Both committees will implement Goals 2, 3, and 4. Goal 5 and Goal 7 will be assigned to the Adult System of Care Committee. Goal 6 will be assigned to the Children's System of Care Committee.
