- Requested under 3/20/2020 1135 waiver:
 - SMI/SED IMD Waiver
 - CPE Protocol and financing changes
 - Flexibility on reporting requirements
 - Expansion of individual counseling for SUD providers

Challenges

- Federal, state and local funding likely to be impacted due to economic impacts
- Community members' loss of employment
- More individuals will qualify for Medi-Cal
- More individual and collective trauma
- Strain on already scarce workforce
- New and emerging BH needs for services

- Personal Protective Equipment
- Funding under SB 89
 - Proposal: \$100 M of \$1 B total for
 - Counties to support critical BH infrastructure impacted by COVID-19 and not fundable through other sources
- MHSA Flexibility?
- Homeless populations
