Service Languages

Detox/Withdrawal Management Services

- Increased Demand for Withdrawal Management (Detoxification)
- Detox Facilities for Adults (4 Providers)
- No Youth Detox Facility in Sacramento County System
- Assessment Needed, Current Waitlist

Residential Treatment

- Increased Demand for Residential Treatment
- Residential Treatment Facilities for Adults Only
- Currently No Youth Residential Treatment
 Facility in Sacramento County System
- Assessment Needed, Current Waitlist

Outpatient Treatment

- Youth and Adults
 - Outpatient Treatment and Intensive Outpatient Treatment
- Treatment on Demand
- Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) Funded
- Access Services Directly at DMC Certified Provider Sites (see resource list)

Sober Living Environments (SLE)/Transitional Living/ Recovery Residences

- Increased Demand for SLE
- SLE Facilities for Adults Only
- 15 units at Mather Campus
 - For people experiencing homelessness and struggling with substance use
 - CalWorks funding eligibility needed

Getting Someone into Treatment

- Alcohol and drug assessment needed for detoxification, residential treatment and sober living services
- No assessment needed for outpatient services.
 People can go straight to a provider on the resource list
