
In Federal Fiscal Year 2016/17, Sacramento County completed the most assessments for newly arriving refugees in the State (44.5%) with the next largest counties being Los Angeles (16.4%) and San Diego (16.4%). During FFY 2016/17, Sacramento County completed 5,309 assessments.

The State of California received 72% of refugees originating from Afghanistan (52%), Iran (12%), and Iraq (8%). Please see the table below for the country of origin for refugees that received assessments through Sacramento County:

Sacramento has the largest number of refugees with Special Immigrant Visas (SIVs) in the nation. SIVs are issued to individuals employed by the US Government in Afghanistan and Iraq. During FFY 2016/17, 3,834 refugees arrived with SIVs. Please see the chart below:
