Public Health Division Update STD/MAPP/OPIOID	<ul> <li>Recently World Health, declared end of Ebola outbreaks; monitoring of travelers ended. A total of 150 travelers were monitored; 4 were tested, which were all negative. The CDC handled the Ebola testing for the first individual that was tested. Results took 2 days. The Public Health Laboratory obtained certification to do Ebola testing; this cut down turn-around time for results to 24 hours. The EMS staff also worked closely on two of the individuals to arrange transportation to the hospital.</li> </ul>

Priorities for 2016	PHAB Goals for 2016  Public health is a broad field, and overlaps greatly with medicine, nursing, economics, sociology, public policy, and many others. Attempting to "narrow the focus" and outline achievable goals is a worthwhile way to begin our new year. Regarding our areas of focus this last year (2015), the Executive Committee suggested the following:  1. Consider the value and feasibility of establishing a needle exchange program for Sacramento County.  This is an area of recent activity, and should remain on the list for next year.  2. Consider the impact of sexually transmitted diseases in Sacramento County. Dr. Kasirye has recently presented information about this to the Board of Supervisors and may have new programs to discuss.  This should remain on the list for next year.

- 3. Follow up on the implementation of the Affordable Care Act in Sacramento County. Consideration of the health care needs of the undocumented immigrant population. Dr. Damiano keeps us informed of progress in a recently enacted program. This no longer needs to be on our list.
- 4. Ways to facilitate and improve collaboration with other Boards and Committees that advise the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors.

This is largely an administrative matter, and no longer needs to be on the list.

5. The MAPP process: helping the Sacramento County Division of Public Health achieve accreditation status.

As reported at the last meeting, this item is again moving forward and we should contribute to this process.

Therefore, we would recommend dropping items (3) and (4) from our list, but continuing our focus on items (1), (2), and (5).

#### **Some New Areas**

As an Advisory Board, some topics we consider during the year will be generated by the needs of the Board of Supervisors and the Department of Health and Human Services staff. However, we should make certain that our work doesn't duplicate that of other County Boards and Committees.

There are many, many potential topics. Always consider: What public health initiatives would our communities want the Board of Supervisors to address?

After discussion with Drs. Heller, Kasirye, and Damiano, here are a couple of suggestions:

1. Refugees are being settled in our County? Are their health care needs being appropriately addressed?

	2. The Board of Supervisors may adopt the "housing first" program presented to our Board last year. In this program, homeless individuals will be put into temporary housing, and then offered the services necessary to succeed.  The question is: Will their health care needs be appropriately addressed?  Other possibilities might deal with:  Food safety Healthcare-associated (nosocomial) infections Injury and violence prevention Nutrition and obesity Availability of wholesome food ("food deserts") Prescription drug practices Vaccination rates in Sacramento County Cancer prevention  • Dr. Orkand elaborated with the Board on which topics will be considered priorities and which topics needed to be removed, as stated above.  • Some suggested Topics:  • Food Deserts  • ER Preparedness (*These topics were not implemented.)
