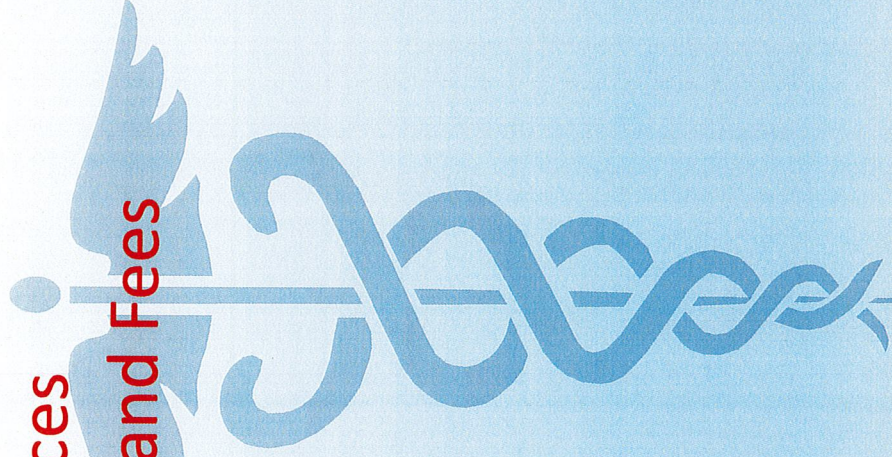

EMS Critical Care Programs

- ▣ For Fiscal Year 2019-20, SCEMSA is proposing adding new programs and staff necessary to develop, implement, and oversee the programs.
- ▣ The proposed new programs and staff will allow SCEMSA to meet the increasing needs of the EMS community, strengthen the EMS system, meet current and upcoming State regulations/mandates and improve quality of prehospital care to Sacramento County communities.
- ▣ Program fees are being developed through a fee study which identifies and analyzing staff/operational expenses required to develop and implement the new programs.

New Regulations
Mandatory and Permissive
Tentative Effective Date 4/1/2019

- ▣ **New mandatory** state regulations: STEMI and Stroke Critical Care Systems
 - The overall goal of the regulations is to reduce morbidity and mortality from acute heart disease and stroke by improving the delivery of emergency medical care within the communities of California.

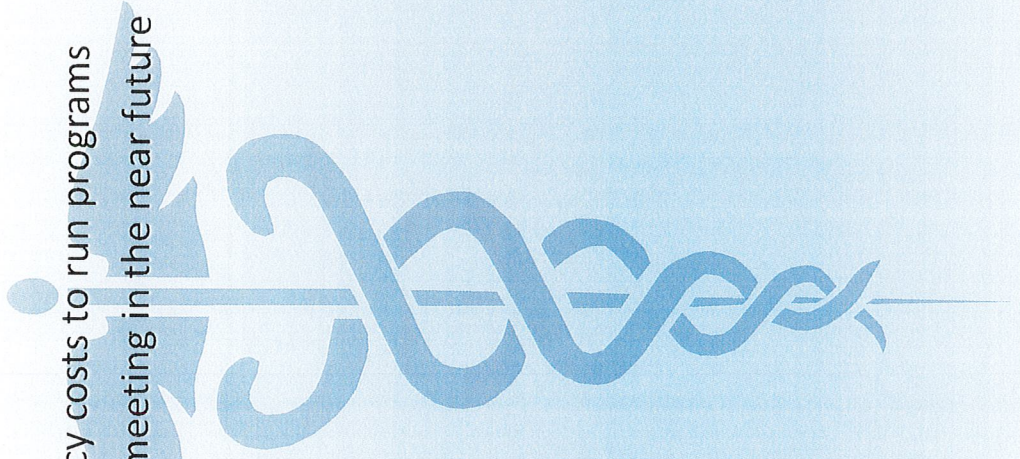
- ▣ **New permissive** state regulations: EMS for Children (EMSC)
 - Allow EMS agencies to develop and implement EMSC programs.
 - EMSC will help reduce pediatric mortality from injury and illness by the development, implementation, and integration of EMSC activities into the entire emergency medical services systems.

Stakeholder Requested Programs

- ▣ Expanded Scope for Public Safety Personnel:
 - Firefighters, peace officers and lifeguards (first responders)
 - Additional treatment skills and medications for anaphylaxis (Epinephrine – Epi pens) and opiate overdoses (Naloxone – Narcan nasal spray)
- ▣ Emergency Medical Responders (EMR):
 - An additional level of certification for Volunteer Fire Departments
 - EMRs have the knowledge and skills necessary to provide interventions
 - Above Public Safety First Aid and below EMT
- ▣ Tactical Medical Training Program:
 - Tactical Medicine for Special Operations first responders respond as an integral part of a SWAT operation team.
- ▣ Critical Care Transport - Paramedic Training Program / Certification:
 - A “Critical Care Transport - Paramedic” (CCT-P) is educated and trained in critical care transport.
 - SCEMSA ALS Providers designated as CCT-P Training Programs
 - SCEMSA accredited Paramedic who has completed a CCT-P training program

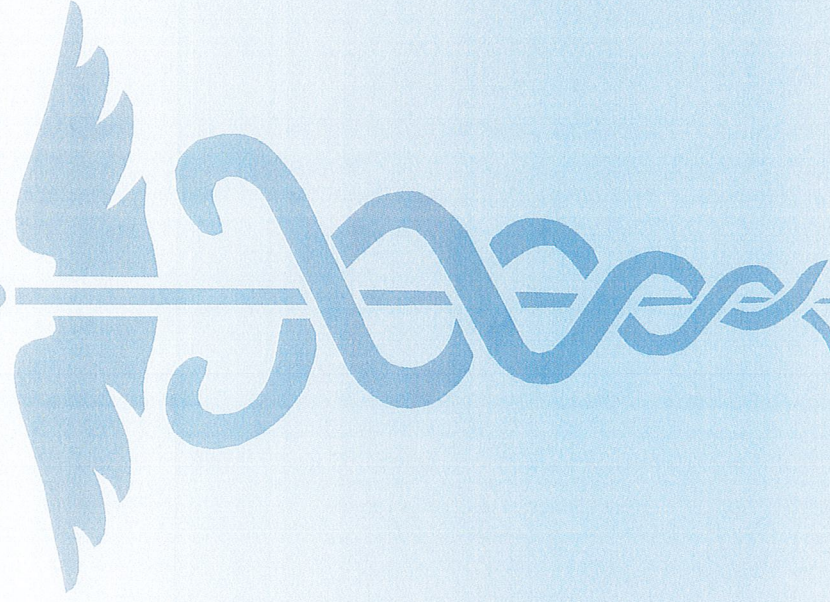
Program Fees

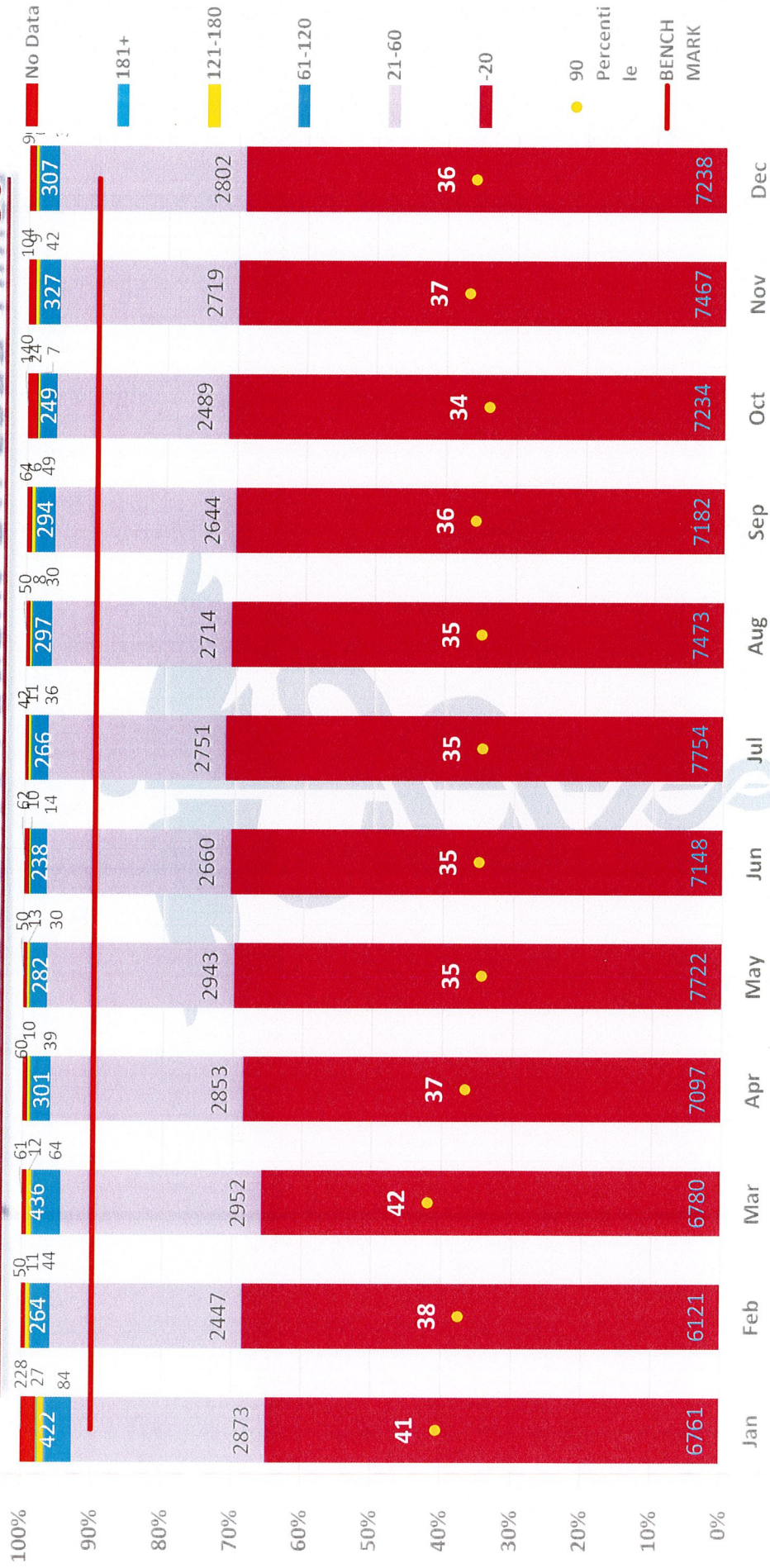

90th Percentile Per Month

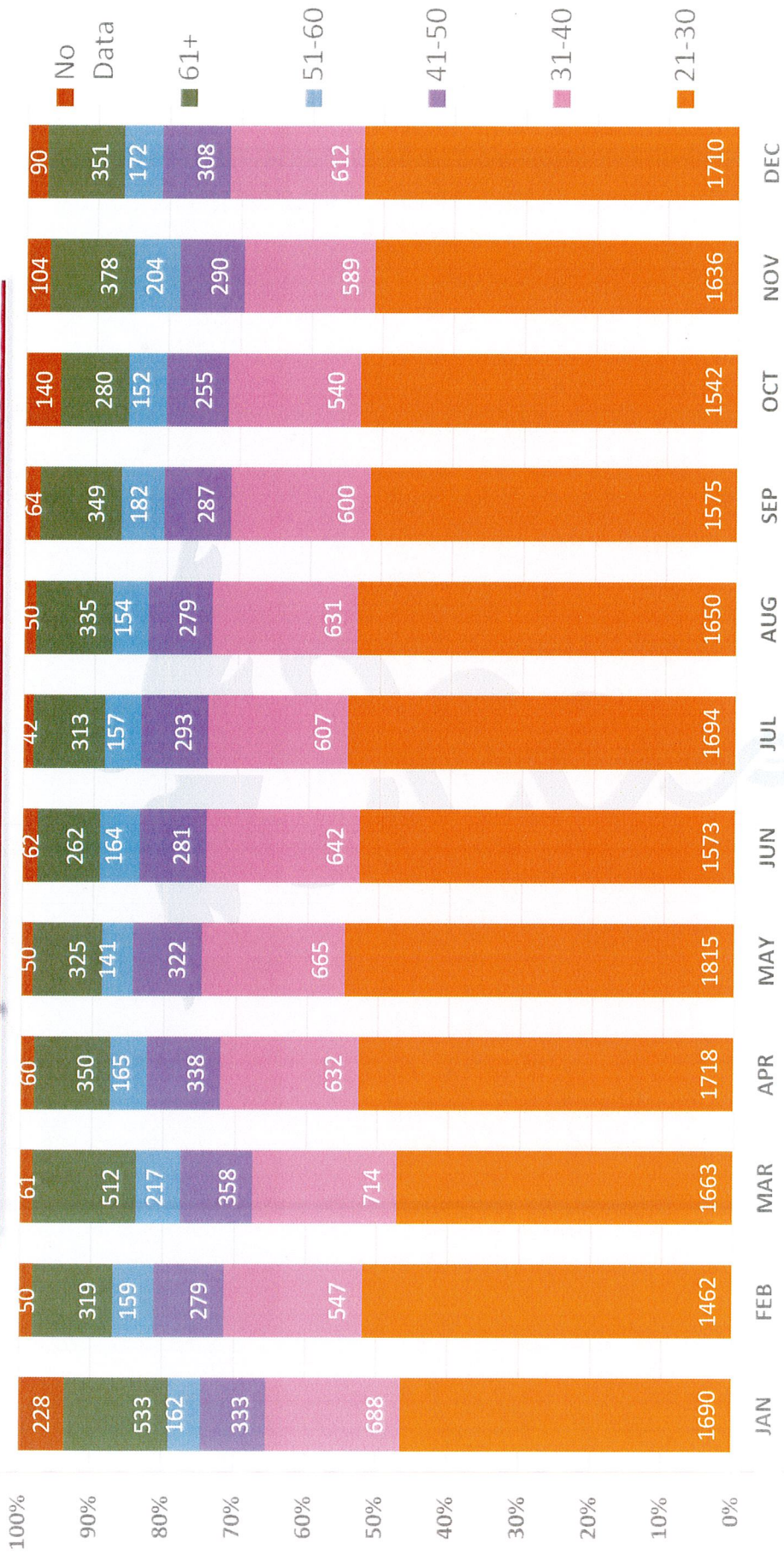


90th Percentile
