

### PHAB REPORT Adult Correctional Health

#### Weekly COVID-19 Data as of September 28, 2022

- Total number of COVID-19 tests since March 2020: 49,959 (*Net increase = 482*)
- Total number of confirmed COVID-19 cases since March 2020: 4,200 (*Net increase = 6*)
- Total number of confirmed COVID-19 cases during the intake observation/quarantine period since March 2020: 909 (*Net increase = 3*)
- Total number of COVID-19 positive inmates currently in custody: Main Jail – 1 / RCCC – 8
- Total number of COVID-19 related deaths: 3

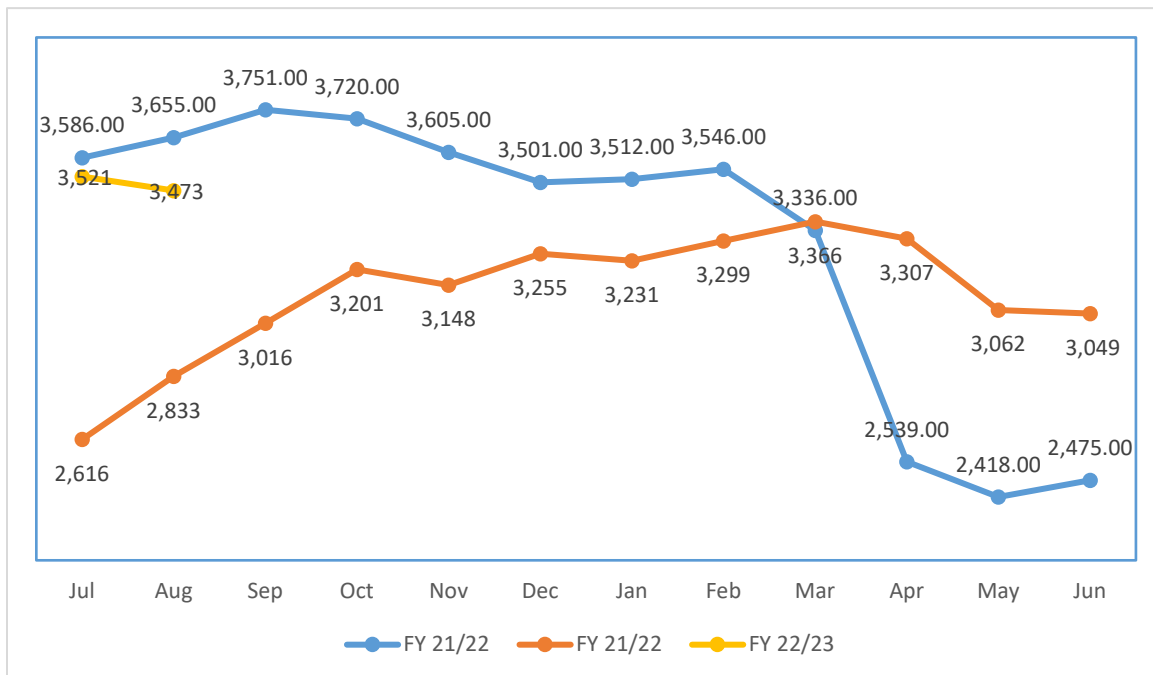

#### Inmate Vaccination Data

As of 9/28/22, 3,206 inmates received at least one COVID-19 vaccine dose.

- Net increase of 13 (thirteen) new inmates receiving initial doses.
- Net increase of 3 (three) 2<sup>nd</sup> doses.
- Net increase of 7 (seven) booster doses.
- Total of 23 doses provided this past week.

#### Jail Facilities Average Daily Population (ADP)



The highest ADP was pre-pandemic in September 2019 (3,751) and the lowest ADP (2,418) was May 2020.

The jails have a very high-churn rate. Short lengths of stay make discharge planning and continuity of care challenging.

#### **Nurse Intakes**

- In FY21/22, RNs completed an average of 2,377 intakes per month.
- In FY 22/23, Nurse intakes exceeded that fiscal year average (July – 2,577, August – 2,496)
- Approximately **32%** of the intakes for each month met the definition of homelessness for FY 21-22 and FY 22-23.
- RN must mark “housed” or “homeless” at intake.

*Homeless Definition: living in a place not meant for human habitation (street, car, river, camp, etc.), shelter, transitional housing, or exiting other institution where they temporarily resided (less than 90 days).*

#### **Chronic Health Conditions**

Daily Population Snapshot for September 28, 2022 = 3,252

- Of the 3,252 adults incarcerated, **69%** of the Daily Population had chronic health conditions.
- Of the 69% with chronic health conditions, **64%** had two or more chronic health conditions.
