2019 TCC Satisfaction Survey Results (Overview)	<ul> <li>Presented by Carol Maytum</li> <li>Pg.2 Methods <ul> <li>60 person distribution list inclusive of active and inactive TCC members. The inactive members have asked to remain on the list to receive information but do not regularly attend meetings.</li> <li>In the future, active membership will be more closely monitored per the guidelines established in the Coalition bylaws. Currently, individuals must attend at least 2 meetings per year to be considered active.</li> <li>Moving forward, the email distribution list will be separated into 2 lists (one for active members and one for info only). Certain emails will only be distributed to active members (such as an invitation to complete the annual TCC Satisfaction Survey).</li> <li>25/60 who were emailed the TCC Satisfaction Survey link completed the survey. However, only about 30-40 of the 60 are active members, so response rate among active members is actually much higher than survey results suggest.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
